STOP NOTICE

ISSUED BY: PEAK DISTRICT NATIONAL PARK AUTHORITY

TO: Bleaklow Industries Ltd, Hassop Avenue, Hassop, Bakewell, Derbyshire DE45 1NS, and  
MMC Mineral Processing Ltd, Charnwood Edge, Syston Road, Cossington, Leicestershire LE7 4UZ.

1. On 23 November 2004 the Authority issued an enforcement notice (of which a copy is attached to this Notice) alleging that there has been a breach of planning control on land at Backdale, Hassop, Longstone Edge in the County of Derbyshire.
2. THIS NOTICE is issued by the Authority in exercise of their power under Section 183 of the 1990 Act, because it is considered that it is expedient that the activity specified in this notice should cease before the expiry of the period allowed for compliance with the requirements of the enforcement notice on the land described in paragraph 3 below. The Authority now prohibit the carrying out of the activity specified in this notice. Important additional information is given in the Annex to this notice.
3. THE LAND TO WHICH THIS NOTICE RELATES  
Land at Backdale, Hassop, Longstone Edge in the County of Derbyshire as shown edged red and hatched black on the attached plan.
4. ACTIVITY TO WHICH THIS NOTICE RELATES  
The winning and working of limestone.
5. WHAT YOU ARE REQUIRED TO DO  
Cease all the activity specified in paragraph 4 of this notice.
6. WHEN THIS NOTICE TAKES EFFECT  
This notice takes effect on 29th January 2006 when all the activity specified in this notice shall cease.

WARNING

THIS NOTICE TAKES EFFECT ON THE DATE SPECIFIED IN PARAGRAPH 6 OVERLEAF

THERE IS NO RIGHT OF APPEAL TO THE OFFICE OF THE DEPUTY PRIME MINISTER AGAINST THIS NOTICE

It is an offence to contravene a stop notice after a site notice has been displayed or the stop notice has been served on you (Section 187(1) of the 1990 Act). If you then fail to comply with the stop notice you will be at risk of immediate prosecution in the Magistrates' Court, for which the maximum penalty is £20,000 on summary conviction for a first offence, and for any subsequent offence. The fine on conviction on indictment is unlimited. If you are in any doubt about what this notice requires you to do, you should get in touch immediately with the Head of Law, Peak District

If you need independent advice about this notice, you are advised to contact urgently a lawyer, planning consultant, or other professional adviser specialising in planning matters. If you wish to contest the validity of the notice, you may only do so by an application to the High Court for judicial review.
